

SERIAL KILLER

SYNOPSIS:

Shelly opens the hotel door to meet Rebekah who is with her minder. Over the course of the next 24 hours they discuss the details of horrific crimes that Shelly has done to 8 victims. At this moment in time Shelly has not turned herself into the police but will after the interviews with Rebekah which she hopes will tell her story for all women in the world who have been wronged by sexual abuse. Rebekah looks like she has won the lottery with the scoop of her career. She takes pictures and video of Shelly. Shelly shows her some of the evidence of the murders and she does it coldly without remorse, in fact she seems overjoyed by the control she had over her victims.

The first day at Gablebrook Shelly is sexually abused by Greening and his gang and made to feel like a slut to the rest of the school. Scared to tell anyone including the fear of her Father finding out, she stays silent but her silence is paid with a heavy price which is 5 years of sexual abuse at the hands of Greening, the school racist and bully. Greening is the youngest of 4 brothers and his Father is in prison. Sexual assault in the playground becomes gang rape in the local park. There is no hiding place for Shelly. Greening has complete control so more attacks occur in public places. Shelly is stripped naked on a train, at the local swimming baths and after the school disco. She is gang raped in empty houses, lock-up garages and wherever Greening chooses.

On the last day of school she suffers humiliation in the morning, embarrassment at lunch and gang rape in the afternoon.

16-year-old Shelly walks out of school for the last time confident her 3 years of hell are over. She is wrong as worse is to come. A final act of sexual violence so extreme the attackers deserved to die. Aged 18 Shelly is kidnapped on her way to work, thrown into a van and taken to a secluded house. The teenage boys were now young men and more evil, cowardly and nasty than before, The final attack lasted 8 hours and the things they did are burned into her memory. Constant laughing, endless threats and verbal abuse. They made her perform every sex act, took pictures and filmed her. Greening encouraged them to slap her, spit and urinate on her clothes. Shelly was at her lowest feeling totally worthless and helpless.

35-year-old Shelly Taylor is watching a SKY News report on historical sex crimes. Famous faces were being named and shamed. She switches channels and Tory MP Paul Greening is attacking grooming gangs and calling for child abusers to be executed. Shelly had never forgotten her abusers and this was a light bulb moment. Thirty years on and Shelly is about to get justice. Revenge is long overdue. But she wasn't going to the police or tipping off the media. She was more interested in "an eye for an eye" punishment.

Using social media she tracks down her attackers and kills them one by one. The first seven are slaughtered but Greening is kidnapped by her gangster lover tortured, videoed confessing before being battered to death. Next Shelly contacts journo Rebekah Woods before handing herself into the police. Why did she not want to get away with murder? Shelly wanted her story in the public domain. She craved publicity. By speaking out she could save other women.

At first the public thought of her as just a evil serial killer but as more and more of her story emerged she became an anti-hero. Rock bands wrote songs about and female columnists wrote sympathetic articles. Shelly Taylor was fast becoming a female icon. Next it's her Old Bailey trial which attracted worldwide media attention. The courtroom was packed every day and outside were TV camera crews from around the Globe. Shelly entered the Witness Box looking like a movie star with her long blonde hair and designer clothes. The court fell silent as she pleaded "not guilty" to all charges. She contradicted her interview with Rebekah Woods for a reason. This meant this time she could tell her story on oath and from the Witness Box. The Judge was not amused.

Her legal team, friends and family could not understand why she seemed so upbeat and happy while facing the rest of her life behind bars.
